## Pumpkin Characters Project:

Your student will be creating a pumpkin character that they will share with the class. I have seen everything from a beautiful Pumpkin Turkey to a Jeremy Lin Pumpkin! Other classes will come by to vote on pumpkins in the hallway.

- 1. Go to the store and buy a pumpkin. You can get any size or color.
- 2. Think of your pumpkin as a head of a person. Decorate the pumpkin as a favorite book character, a famous person, animal or whatever person you would like to do. Maybe a princess pumpkin, teacher pumpkin, or even a dog pumpkin. Can you imagine a Mrs. McClintock pumpkin? A Mr. Threet pumpkin?
- 3. On a sheet of paper, type or *neatly* write a brief paragraph (5-8 sentences) telling me about your pumpkin person. What is your pumpkin's name? Why did you select your person, character or animal? Describe with details how you created it.
- 4. Bring your pumpkin person to school on Tuesday, October 23rd.
- \*\*\*Please do not cut/carve/poke into these pumpkins, as they will rot. Only decorate the outside of the pumpkin.

## Characters Come Alive:

I'm excited to announce that our class will be having Book Character Day in a few weeks on <u>Wednesday, October 3|st</u>. On that day, each student should come to school dressed up as a character from a favorite book. The character must be from a book they have read (not from a movie or cartoon they have watched), and your child should be prepared to describe both the character and the book by writing a 5-8 sentence paragraph explaining who they are.
