

Classic Book Report

Materials needed:

- Paper to write or type your book report paragraphs.

Details:

1. Create a classic book report by writing or typing in the form of paragraphs.
2. Provide information about each question/section on the book report rubric. All elements from the rubric must be written in your book report.
3. Make sure your work is neat and all writing is legible – typing is not required!

Lunch Bag Book Report

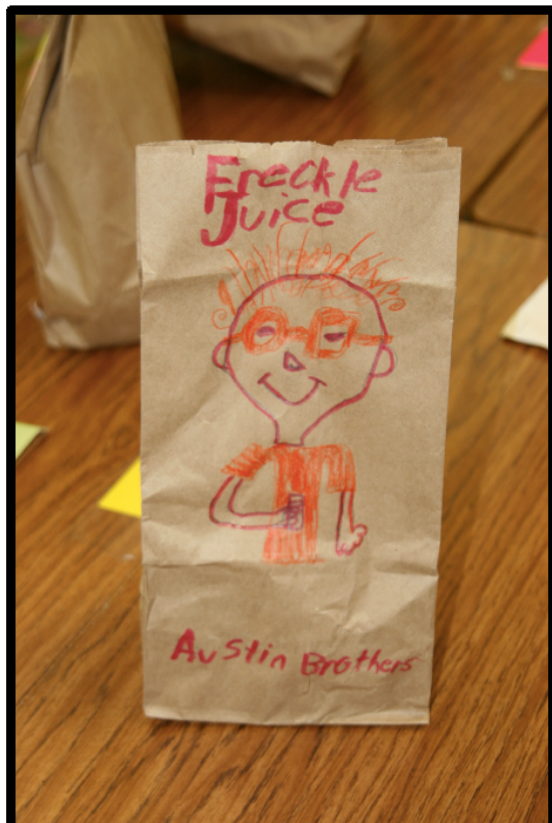
Materials needed:

- 1 paper lunch bag (white or brown 😊) – I will be happy to provide one, just ask!
- Art supplies: colored pencils, crayons, markers, etc. (to decorate the front of the bag)
- 4 – 5 items (models, pictures, or drawings of the items will work just fine) to represent the required elements of the book report (see rubric)

Details:

- 1 Write the title, author, genre of your book, as well as your name on the front of the lunch bag along with a drawing/illustration to go along with it – be creative
- 2 Fill the bag with 4 – 5 items to help you retell the story/cover all of the required elements of the book report (see rubric)
- 3 On the back of the lunch bag, write 3 – 5 sentence review of the book – did you enjoy the book? Would you recommend it to a friend? What type of reader would enjoy it?

Pizza Box Book Report

Materials needed:

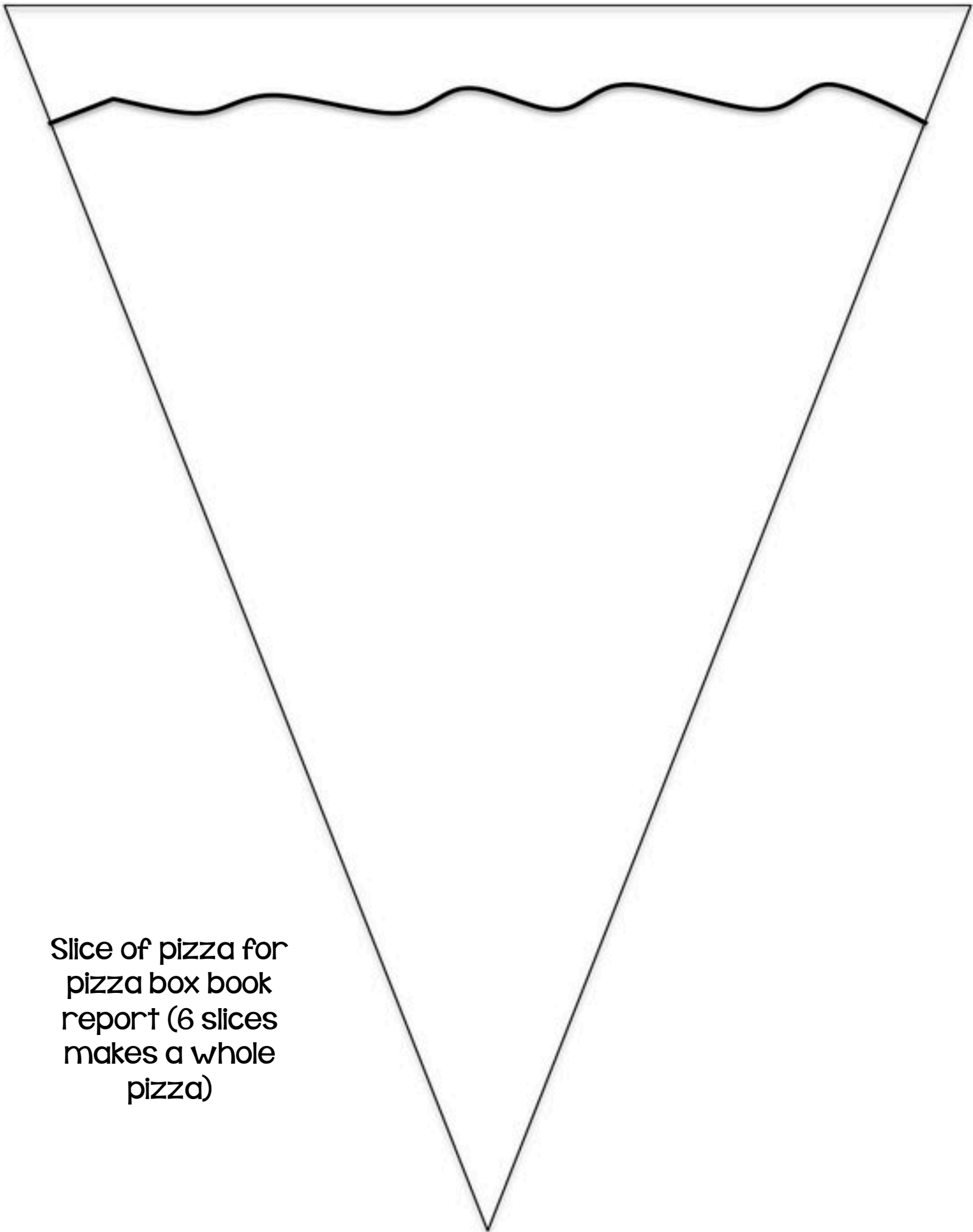
- 1 recycled (CLEAN!) pizza box
- Art supplies: colored pencils, crayons, markers, etc. (to decorate the front of the box)
- Paper or other recycled cardboard to create the “pizza slices”

Details:

1. Write the title, author, genre of your book, as well as your name on the front of the box along with a drawing/illustration to go along with it – be creative
2. Use the paper/recycled cardboard to create pizza slices (I have a pizza slice template – let me know if you need it!)
3. Use each “slice” of the pizza to communicate the required elements of the book report (ie – slice 1 – characters, slice 2 – theme, etc)

Sandwich Book Report

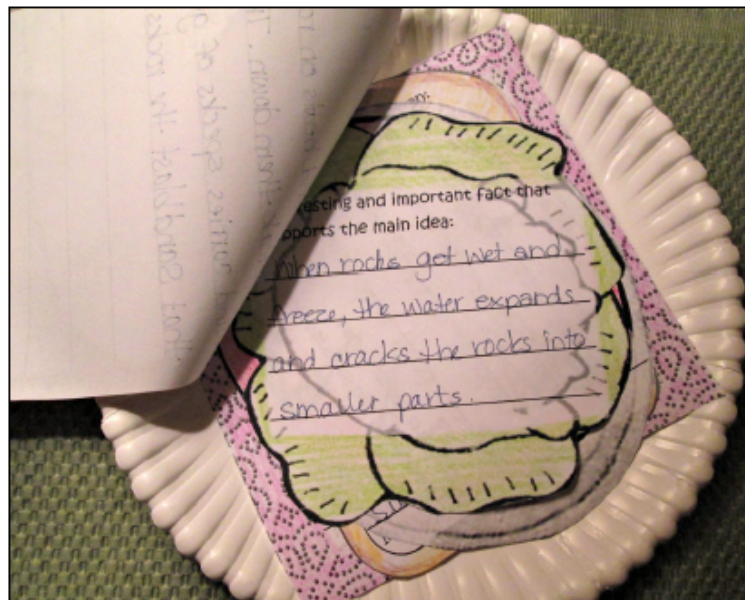
Materials needed:

- 1 “sandwich template” (Ask your teacher for a copy if there are no extra copies in the binder!)
- Art supplies: colored pencils, crayons, markers, etc. (to decorate the parts of the “sandwich”)
- 1 binder ring to bind the pieces together (will be provided)

Details:

1. On the top slice of bread, draw/illustrate an image that represents the book, write the title, author, genre and your name
2. On the back slice of bread, write 3 – 5 sentence review of the book – did you enjoy the book? Would you recommend it to a friend? What type of reader would enjoy it?
3. Use the “sandwich toppings” to include the required elements of the book report (ie- lettuce – characters and setting, lunch meat – plot/sequence)
4. Color and cut all pieces of the “sandwich” and bind together using a hole puncher and a binder ring (Ask your teacher for a binder ring if you need one)

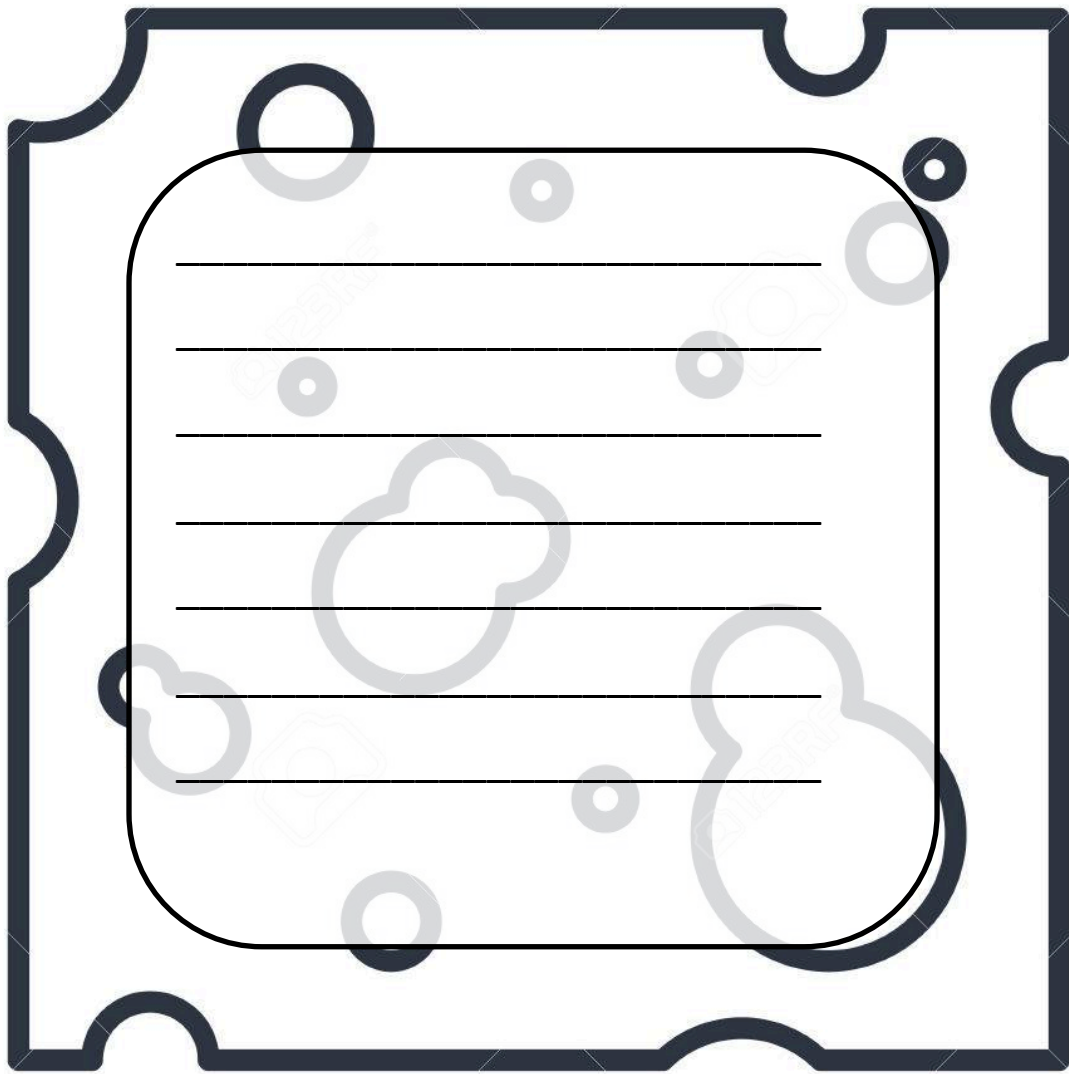

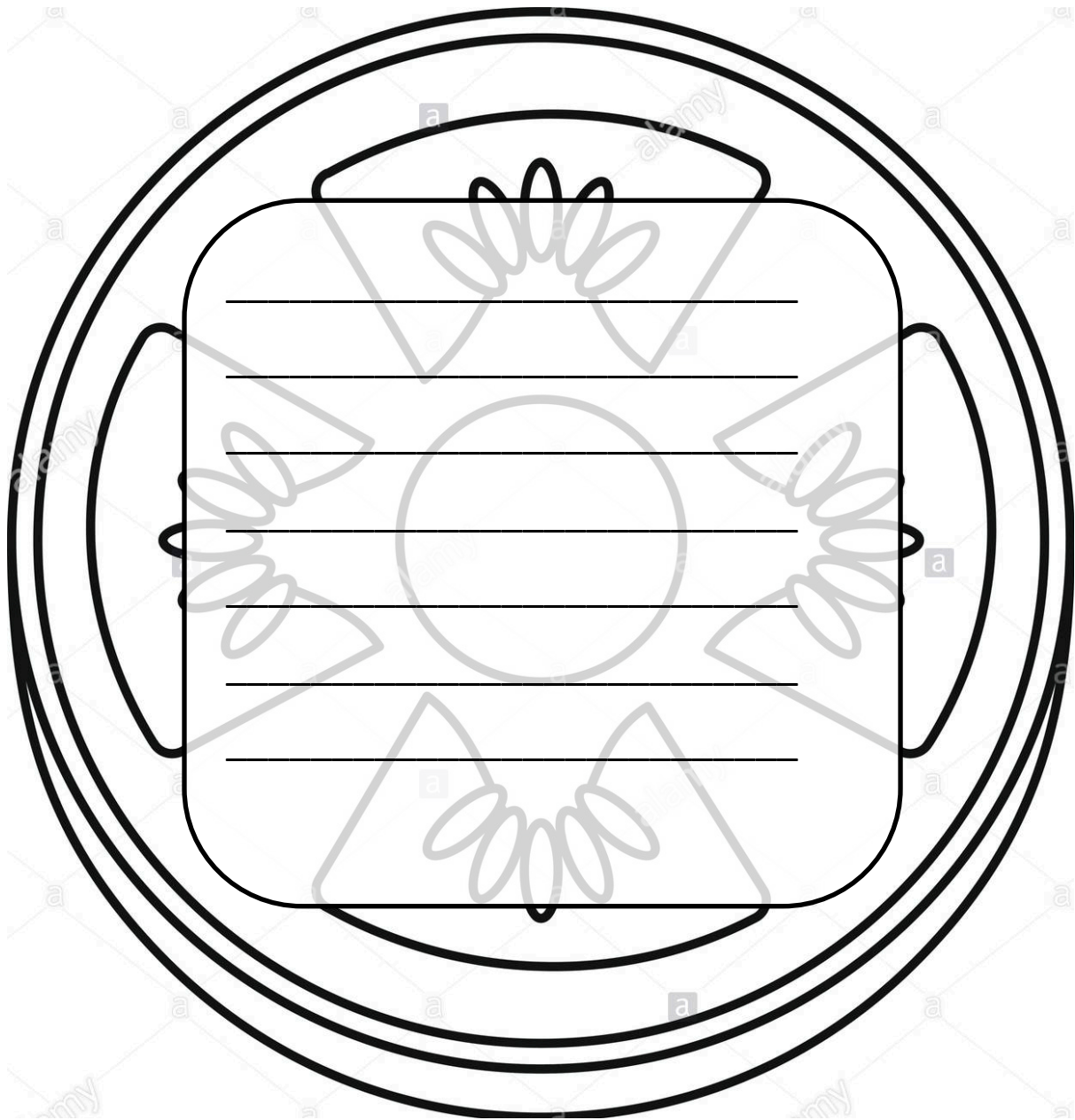

Wordless Picture Book

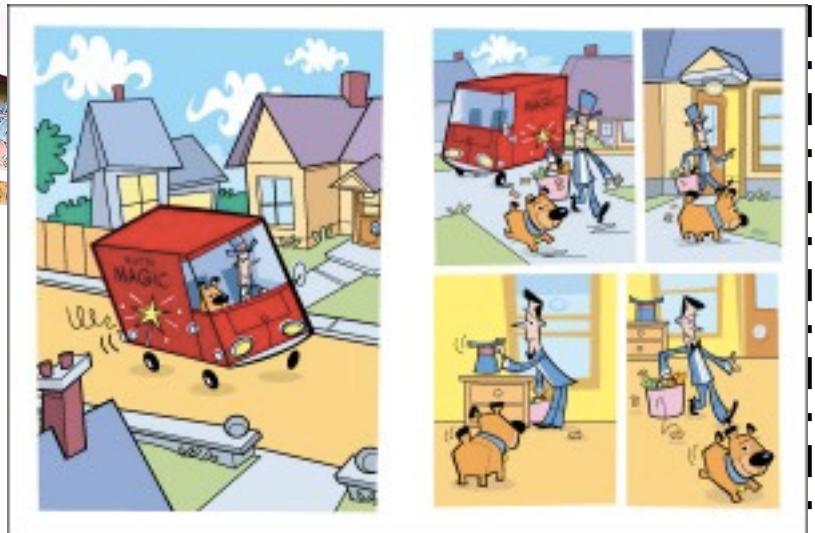
Materials needed:

- 1 blank book (provided by your teacher!)
- Art supplies: colored pencils, crayons, markers, etc. (to illustrate your book)

Details:

1. On the front, please write the title, author, genre of the book and your name
2. Use the pages of the book report to illustrate all of the required elements of the book report – make sure to use lots of detail and color 😊 if a picture book doesn't have any words, it must show detail through images!!
3. On the back cover, write 3 – 5 sentence review of the book – did you enjoy the book? Would you recommend it to a friend? What type of reader would enjoy it?

Talk Show Interview

Materials needed:

- Paper to write down your interview questions and answers
- Pencil
- Video Camera (if you choose to film your interview at home)

Details:

1. You will “host” a talk show interview with one of the main characters from the book.
2. Your interview questions should cover all of the required elements of the book report – make sure your questions are detailed and interesting! 😊
3. Write down your questions for the character you have decided to interview on a piece of paper.
4. Practice asking your character these questions and a response that your character might say. You are not writing a script for your interview – only questions.
5. You may film your interview at home and bring to school to show the class, or you can conduct your character interview at school for the class. Make sure you are asking the character questions, but also answering the character’s questions.

Examples of Interview Questions

- What is your full name? What do people call you?
- Where are you from originally?
- Where do you live now? Who do you live with?
- What are some things you enjoy?
- What are a few things you dislike?
- How would you describe your personality?
- How have you been? Has anything interesting happened recently?
- What is something you have struggled with recently, and how did you handle that situation?

Book Report Poster

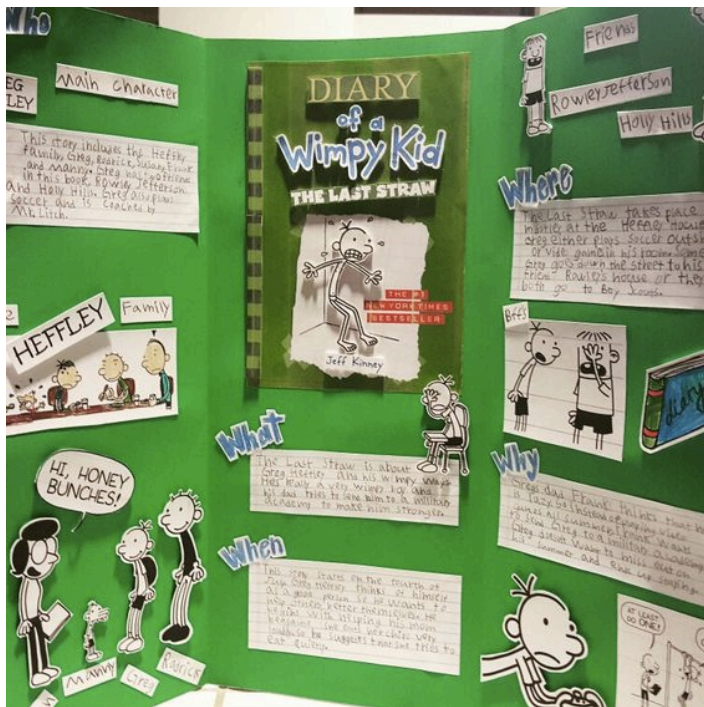
Materials needed:

- 1 poster board or tri-board
- Art supplies: colored pencils, crayons, markers, glue etc. (to decorate the poster)
- Paper to write or type the required elements of the book report

Details:

1. Create a poster board that displays all of the required elements of the book report
2. Make sure your work is neat and all writing is legible – typing is not required!

Commercial

(T.V. or Radio)

Materials needed:

- Video camera or voice recorder to record your commercial
- Art supplies: colored pencils, crayons, markers, glue etc. (to decorate the poster)
- Commercial template (provided by your teacher to guide your commercial)

Details:

- 1 Use the provided template to record a commercial for TV or radio.
- 2 Please make sure your commercial includes the required elements explained on the rubric
- 3 Your commercial should be fun and interesting. You can make it funny or serious – it's up to you!
- 4 You may email your audio or video recording to your teacher or bring it in on a USB flash drive.

This book report commercial does not include all of the required elements. Your commercial **MUST** include all of the elements listed on the rubric.

CEREAL BOX BOOK REPORT

Your assignment is to design a cereal related to a fictional book. You will also decorate a real cereal box with illustrations, text and even a prize inside!



FRONT OF BOX: Include the name of the cereal and a picture. Invent a name for the cereal that is related to book, yet sounds like a cereal. Do not use the exact title of the book. Choose a shape for the cereal as well as colors and ingredients that all relate to the book.

RIGHT SIDE: Make a list of ingredients that includes the story elements (main characters and setting). Under the heading "Ingredients," list the main characters and the setting and write at least 1 sentence about each.

LEFT SIDE: Write a one-paragraph summary that describes the main problem and the solution of the book. Try to use words that will "grab" the reader's attention and make them want to buy your cereal.

BACK OF BOX: Design a game that is based on the story. It can be a puzzle, word search, word scramble, maze, crossword puzzle, hidden picture illustration, or any other fun activity. Make sure that it includes information from the book.

TOP OF BOX: Include the title, author, number of pages, and the number of stars you would give the book if you were a book critic. The maximum number is 5 stars.

PRIZE: Your prize must be something the main character could have used in the book or something that reminds you of the main character. You must include a picture of the prize on the front of your box. You may actually put a prize in your box!

DON'T FORGET!

Proofread carefully to avoid errors in grammar, spelling and/or punctuation. Cereal box must be colorful and creatively designed. Cereal box must be neatly assembled and written portions need to be easy to read!

Your assignment is to write and illustrate a comic related to the book you just read. The comic should cover a major scene or turning point in the story. Use the space below to plan your comic!








